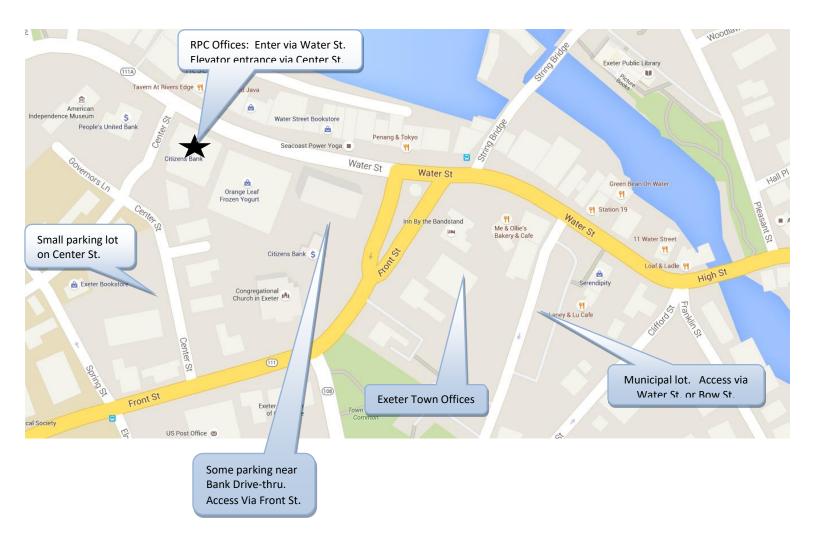

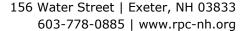

1. Chairman McDermott convened the meeting at 9 a.m. and attendees introduced themselves

2. Minutes of December 7, 2017

Christiansen moved to approve the Minutes of December 7, 2017 as presented; Gerrato seconded. **SO VOTED** 1 abstention

3. TIP Amendment #4

Walker referred to Attachment 2 and reviewed the changes proposed to the 2017-2010 TIP and STIP. He noted the public comment period will be March 12-April 10th. The net increase in funding for the projects is just over \$11 million. He reviewed several new CMAQ projects and project scope changes to existing projects, along with funding/cost changes. He explained that NHDOT has not released Fiscal Constraint yet and Air Quality Conformity is not necessary as the region remains in Attainment. Amendment #4 is scheduled to go before the Policy Committee in April. *Moore moved to Recommend approval of Amendment #4 for the 2017-2020 TIP to the MPO Policy Committee pending fiscal constraint; Gerrato seconded.* **SO VOTED.**

4. Electric Vehicle Infrastructure-NHDES

Jessica Wilcox, Program Coordinator for Clean City, NHDES, gave a presentation on Electric Vehicle Infrastructure in the region. She explained that it's estimated there will be 266,000 electric vehicles on the road by the year 2030, especially with the cost of batteries decreasing, increased of miles per charge on most models, and reduced maintenance costs. She explained BEV and PHEV cars. She reviewed the types of

charging stations available and discussed how municipalities can start planning for charging station installations in the future by including necessary components into the construction phase of projects on municipal property or parking lots. She explained that NH needs a comprehensive State Charging Plan for EVs and more promotion of electric vehicles within the municipalities, via tax credits and zoning and building codes. Discussion followed on municipality costs to install charging stations, locations already in existence, and the options for school bus companies and DPWs to use EVs.

5. Legislative Update

Bogle distributed a Memo listing four bills the RPC is tracking currently and reviewed each (SB560 Updating State Trails Plan; HB1731 Regulating Bicycles; HB1763 Road Usage Fee; HB1616 RPCs and government funding).

Discussion followed regarding the road usage fees and also on the status of rail trail from Hampton to Portsmouth. General consensus was that the HB1763 Road Usage Fees be brought forward to the MPO for discussion.

6. TAC Training

Walker presented information on the MPO transportation planning process and MPO Core Functions. He reviewed the Transportation Advisory Committee's role in Plan development, and function within the MPO.

7. Project Updates - Distributed; No discussion

Bogle noted that the RPC email has been sent to many peoples spam folders lately and it might be necessary to check your spam folder if you haven't received any recent emails from the RPC. If you find one in the spam folder simply mark it as Not being Spam and the system will learn and correct the problem for future emails.

Attached is a report that lists the changes that Amendment #4 proposes to make to the 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) within the Rockingham Planning Commission region. The full STIP revision report is also available on the RPC website (www.rpc-nh.org) for those interested in the proposed changes to projects from other parts of the state. Overall, there are 11 Statewide and 13 regional project changes (24 total) proposed that the RPC needs to address in the TIP, and these take the form of project removals and additions, funding amount changes, as well as adjustments to project scope and timing. At the same time, the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) is also being updated to maintain consistency between the project lists in the two documents. The MPO is conducting a 30 day public comment period on Amendment #4 that will begin on March 12, 2018 and will conclude on April 10th, 2018. A final opportunity for comments will be during the public hearing at the April 11th, 2018 RPC Meeting at a location to be determined. The MPO will take action on the amendment at the conclusion of the public hearing.

Analysis

This amendment consists of the changes to 13 regional projects and 12 statewide programs and results in a net increase in cost of just over \$14.0 million. *Table 1* on the following page provides a brief overview of the changes to each project, as well as the general reasoning for that change. There are eight projects undergoing a scope change and only one of those (Hampton 41797) is changing cost as well. There are six projects that are being added into the TIP. Five of those projects are from the most recent CMAQ funding round, while the sixth is a statewide project that needs to be added. Two projects are showing reduced cost while six are increasing in cost. Two of the projects with cost increases (FTA5339 and BRDG-T3/4 M&P) are incorporating funding from projects being removed from the TIP. Four projects are being removed from the TIP and in all cases, the scope and funding for those projects is being incorporated into other existing projects and programs. Project Hampton 29609 is being incorporated into Hampton 41797, Statewide 15609I and BRMT are being incorporated into the BRDG-T3/4-M&P Program (as well as the BRDG-T1/2-M&P Program which is not included in the amendment as it shows the proper funding already), and FTA5309 is being incorporated into the FTA5339 Program.

Attached is a report that provides the details of each project and compares the existing status with the changes proposed in Amendment #2. This report provides full project cost and scheduling details for the TIP projects impacted the amendment and differs from those used in the past in that the existing and amended funding for each project are shown side-by-side. For each project, the report lists the project

number, name, location, and scope, as well as the existing and proposed total project costs (includes years beyond the TIP). Below the general information for each project, the phases and accompanying fiscal years are listed on the left, the existing funding itemization in the center, and the proposed amended funding on the right *listed using shaded, italicized text*. Beyond the amended funding amounts is a listing of the funding sources for each project phase. The bottom of the report includes information regarding the regional significance of the project, the agency it is managed by, and the Clean Air Act Amendment codes.

 National Ambient Air Quality Standards (the 2008 ozone standard) and as of April 6, 2015, the
 1997 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (the 1997 ozone standard) is revoked
 for all purposes, including transportation conformity purposes in the Boston-ManchesterPortsmouth (SE) NH area. For this reason, no air quality conformity analysis is necessary.
